

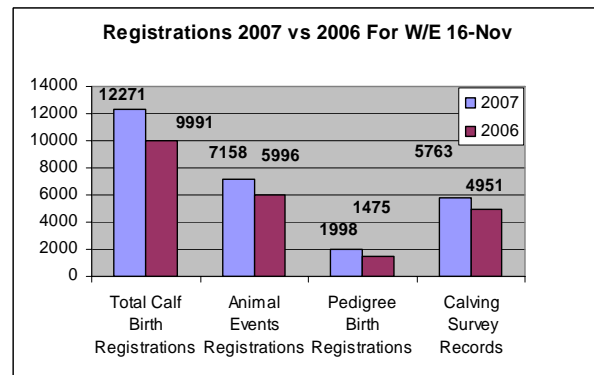
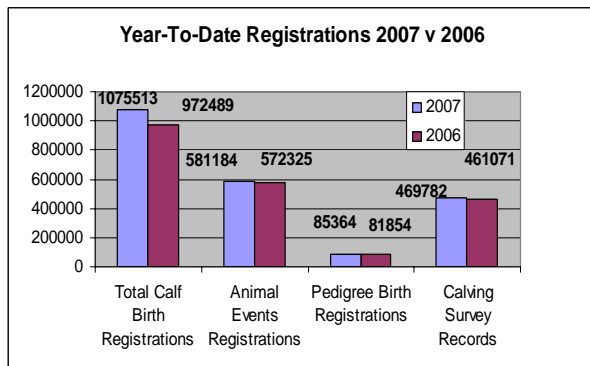

**2 Database Update**



- 359,125 inseminations have been received so far in 2007, compared with 159,312 in 2006 for the same period.
- Updates to the Dairy and Beef Calving reports have been finalised this week.
- Preparations are continuing in order to be ready for the commencement of the Suckler Cow Welfare Scheme. Developments and changes to a number of screens and forms are underway.
- Work is continuing on the Sire Advice module for the new season.
- The implementation of the new hardware solution and database upgrade is on-going. The upgrade of the development machine will take place over the coming days.
- Preparatory work for the go-live of remaining Munster AI technicians is underway, with ICBF working in conjunction with the Munster AI staff.

**DAIRY AUTUMN 2007**

- ✚ The Autumn programme is starting to wind down. There are now 120 herds signed up, taking a total of 4,475 doses.
- ✚ Approximately 12 more herd are required to reach our target.
- ✚ A majority of the remaining herds had their straws packed this week. A total of 4,049 doses have been dispatched to date.

- ✚ Work on developments for the EBI is on-going. Specific areas include calving performance, across breed, and linear evaluations. Results will be presented at industry meeting next week.
- ✚ Staff made a presentation on EBI at a meeting of the pure Friesian club AGM.

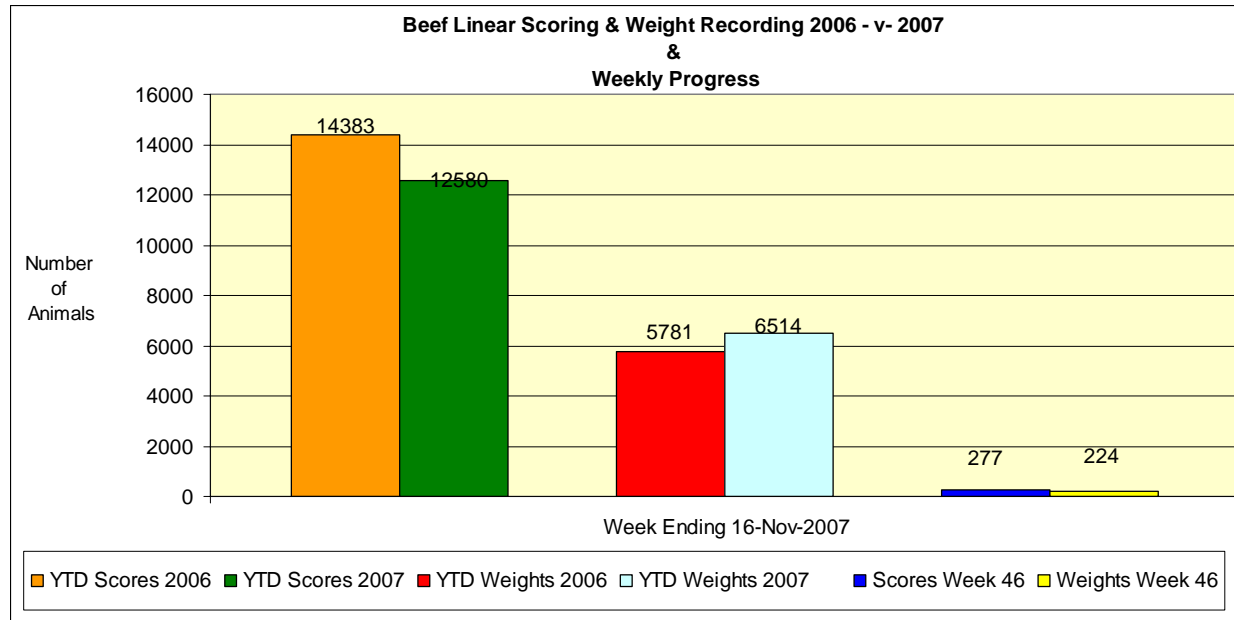
