



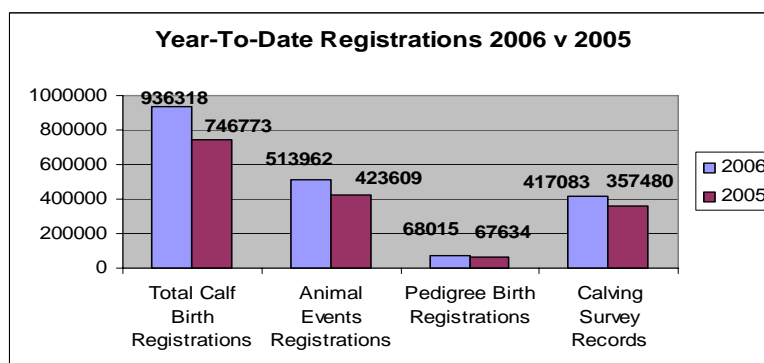
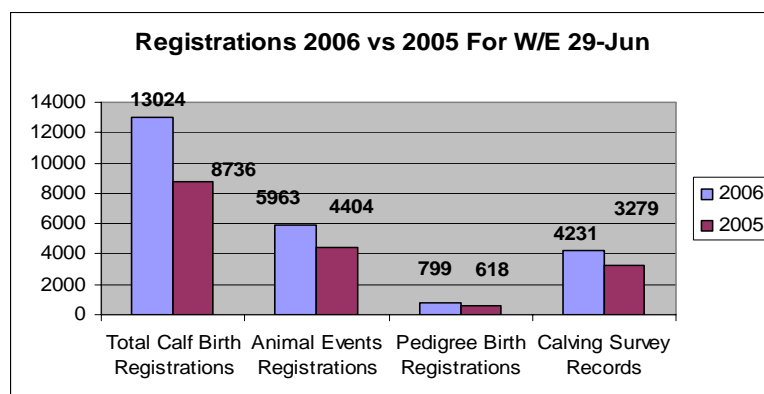
Update for period 24th – 30th June 2006

2 Database Update

- ✚ 57 new herds added to the database last week.
- ✚ Over 115,000 inseminations have now been recorded on the AI handhelds. This is an average of 1,500 per handheld.
- ✚ Nearly 500 separate animal events have been recorded since the launch of online animal events in Kildalton last week. This is proving to be very popular with the farmers who are using the system with the most popular comment being the benefit of the data checking, which checks the data before its saved and highlights any potential issues e.g. incorrect tags.
- ✚ The review of AI handheld system began this week and is proving very productive.
- ✚ An update of slaughter data was received from DAFF and loaded into the database. This was in the region of 208,000 records.
- ✚ Work is continuing on the procurement of mart data.. Sample data from one mart has been loaded to the database.
- ✚ John Moloney (A.I Handheld Field Support Team) leaves ICBF today. We are very grateful to John for the contribution he has made to the success of the handheld system at Dovea and wish him the very best for the future.

- Reports support – how to use the information (distinction here – it's not advice rather information and how to use it).

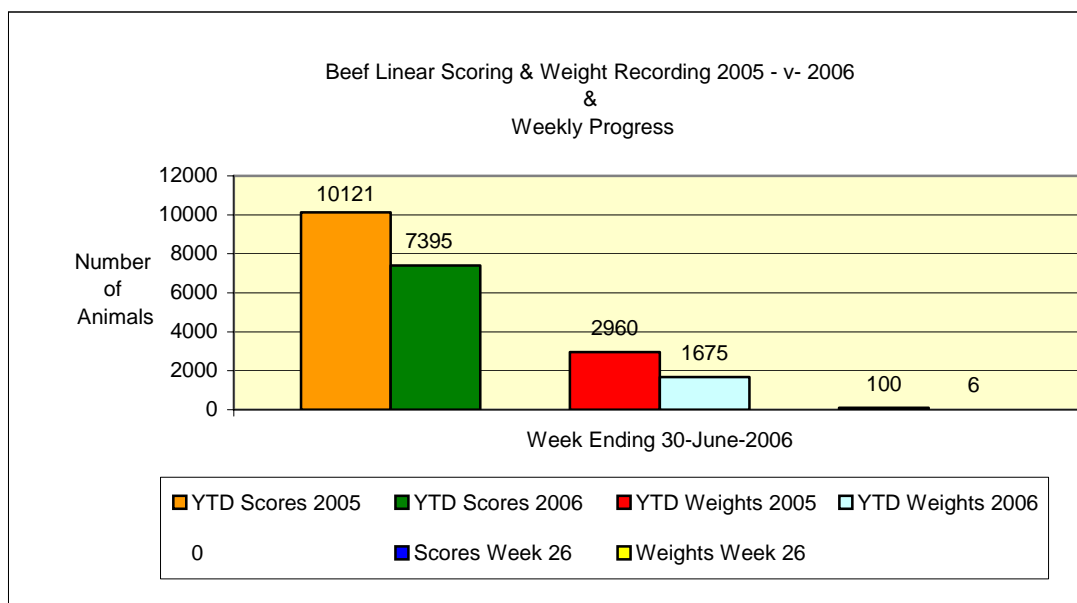
5) High EBI Animal referral

7 Developments in Dairy Genetic Evaluations - ICBF Dairy Breeding Industry Meeting

- ✚ An industry consultation meeting to discuss developments in dairy breeding evaluations took place on Thursday 29th June in the Abbeyleix Manor Hotel. The key objective of the meeting was to discuss priorities for dairy genetic evaluations over the coming 5 months ahead of possible implementation in November.
- ✚ A list of possible work areas were presented to the consultative group). The meeting was then divided up into 5 groups with each group asked to discuss each of the areas and then come back with its top priorities for possible implementation in November. The results of the group consultative process are given in Table 1.
- ✚ As a result of the consultative process, ICBF and its project partners, have a clear list of work priorities for the coming 5 months. These are:
 - a. Update economic values in EBI
 - b. Consider multiple indexes.
 - c. Genetic evaluations for farmer satisfaction.
 - d. Across breed evaluations.
 - e. Genetic evaluations for mastitis incidence and lameness.
 - f. Update calving performance.
- ✚ The next meeting of the dairy industry consultative group will take place in early September (date to be finalised).
